Lead On! Leadership Conference

March 11-12, 2011

Highlights

According to the latest United States census, more than 40% of all adults in America are single. These single adults could be young adults who just aren't married yet, adults who have never married, adults who are divorced or widowed, adults with children, or adults without children. Most adults who attend a single adult activity are between the ages of 35—59. Many of these adults have the potential to be a great single adult ministries leader. The adults who attended the recent leadership conference were there to learn more about singles' ministry and how to have an engaging, thriving, purposeful Christ-centered ministry to singles.

Dennis Franck, who is the national singles' ministry leader for the Assemblies of God church, was our presenter. He had many interesting things to say. Friday night, about 40 people attended and Dennis talked about trends that affect single adult ministry. He had just received the latest census statistics and was excited about sharing them. Some of these statistics include 61.5 million adults who have never married, 23.7 million who are divorced and 14.3 million adults who are widowed. Another 5.5 million adults are separated. He also shared how the make-up of the family has changed. Now, instead of the nuclear family, there are single-parent families, step/blended parent families, divorced/step/blended families, and divorced/remarried families. Because single adults come from such diverse backgrounds and experiences, ministry to single adults needs to be diverse, as well.

Some of the areas of ministry include: relational ministry that provides opportunities for people to meet and build friendships; social ministry that provides healthy, fun appealing activities; intellectual ministry which provides teaching, seminars and classes to address issues of singles; emotional ministry which provides support through programs and counseling; spiritual ministry which provides spiritual growth, discipleship and salvation; and, last but not least, recreation or physical ministry which provides sports and recreation. All of these ministry areas can be addressed or we can pick and choose which ones we, as a group, would like to concentrate on.

Saturday was a day of brainstorming and discussion regarding making our singles' group better. We were divided into groups and asked to evaluate how we were doing in each area of ministry and to set some goals for each area. The group I was in decided sky diving would be an attainable goal and something that would be fun for our group. We don't have anything concrete, yet, though, so don't hold your breath. :) There were lively discussions at all four tables with some ideas and goals being compiled from the discussion.

Saturday evening at the Christian Life Ministries building, Dennis presented the Six Principles of a great leader. These principles include: servant-hood, ownership, responsibility, authority, accountability and unity.

Lead On! Leadership Conference Highlights, cont.

The first principle, servant-hood, reminds us that Jesus was a servant and told us in Mark chapter 10 that “whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant.” There is always room for a person who is willing to serve. “A person can do much for Christ if s/he doesn’t care who gets the credit.”

The second principle, ownership, has to do with the fact that people have a tendency to support what they help to create. Someone who helps plan and implement activities, even if they fail, have ownership and will work harder to make sure they succeed next time.

The third principle, authority, is where leaders need to have authority and it is important that they handle it wisely. Responsibility without authority is puppetry.

The fourth principle deals with accountability. Everyone needs to be accountable to someone. Accountability helps people mature.

The fifth principle is unity. Unity encourages us to work together graciously, without complaining or criticizing.

The sixth principle, responsibility, of course, deals with the fact that if we volunteer or are given a job to do, we must follow through.

These six principles work together to create a good leader and a great leadership team.
